**10. Highway Matters**

a) Complaint concerning the lane passing the railway rank toward Cwm, edge of road breaking off persistent rain has damaged the tarmac. Drain blocked near the railway bridge. Council have been out and taken photographs however there has been no action. Around two weeks ago two Council workmen went further up the lane supposedly to fill holes in. What they did was deemed to be disgraceful work, couple of barrow-fulls of tarmac was trodden in and then lorry ran over them. Holes were not filled in correctly – it was an absolute waste of time – a mornings work for two men, quality of work left a lot to be desired.

b) Rubbish/Trailer with rubbish/Caravans in the road by Llangurig School – resident written to twice but nothing has changed – has anyone from the Council been out to assess? The bank has been chopped back by the passing of vehicles and a lot of complaints about the situation have been made by members of the community. There have been reports that rats have been seen – Clerk to refer to Environmental Health.

c) A fence has fallen over at the approach down into the car park where children tend to play and grass has started to grow over it. Community Council are concerned about the danger to the children – Health & Safety issue?
